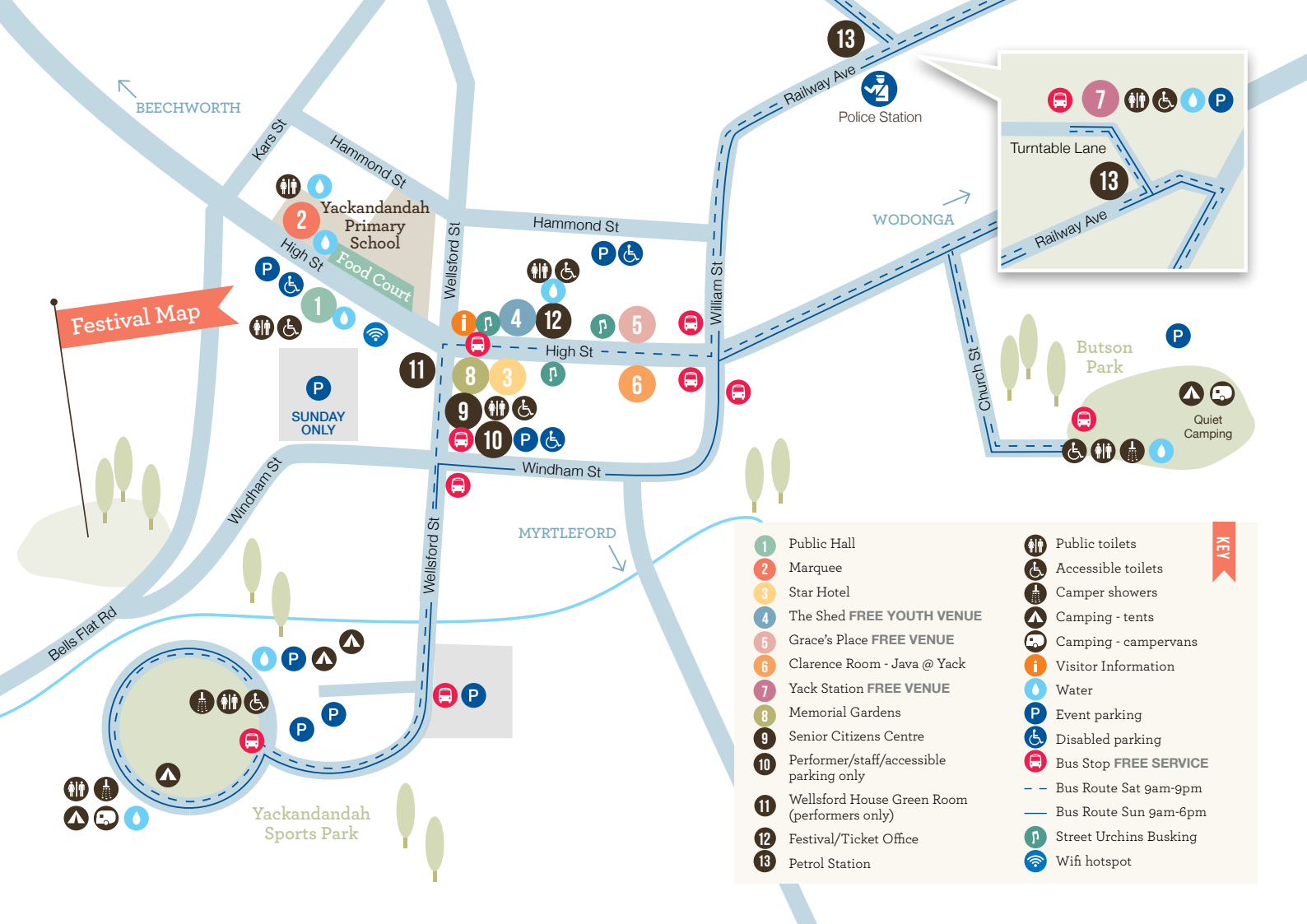

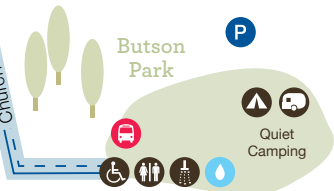
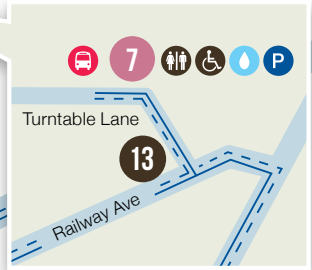

Adrian Clark This Albury/Wodonga indie singer-songwriter will whisk you away with his soulful melodies & inspiring lyrics. A new twist on the old classics, this one man, one guitar show will take you on a journey about life, music, love & beyond.

Anna Cordell plays delicate yet deceptively complex folk music. Her voice is rich & tender, yet lyrically her music is filled with conflict. After the release of her EP last year, Cordell has been invited to open for Clare Bowditch & Archie Roach, & begins work on her album this year.

Appalachian Heaven String Band members have more than thirty years' experience playing the old time mountain music of America. Their instrumental prowess & strong lead vocals have entertained audiences in uplifting & heart-warming festival performances across Australia & NZ.



Black Market Tune (Austria) These Austrian World Music Award recipients are an outstanding example of musicians networking across Europe, & the profound impact of the Celtic Folk genre. With many strands of ethno, American & European folk, they present a powerful musical tapestry. Their first recording *Nightfire* appeared in 2013 & this tour will launch their second CD.

BLEACH is acoustic duo Xavier Carthew & Sean Nudl- two young 16 year old singer/guitarists from Bendigo. Still at school, they've been polishing their musical skills at local festivals, markets & pubs, performing together for just 1 year.

The Bon Scotts with their trademark satire, charm, & penchant for nonstop folk pop, their music examines lost love, seedy friendships, the free market & summer's golden promise. Continuing to push the boundaries, with all kinds of percussive oddities, alongside analogue synths, programmed drums, vocoders & a small symphony.

Broads is the musical partnership of Kelly Day & Jane Hendry. With years of singing together in vocal vintage pop group *The Nymphs* (as seen on *Spicks & Specks*, *RockKwiz*), Kel & Jane have developed a harmonic symbiosis that is evident in their luscious harmonies & their interactions during live shows.

Candice McLeod This young, creative, nomadic songstress, originally from south-east QLD, has her travelling shoes permanently on these days. During the past three years she has lived a gypsy life on the road, touring Australia with her modern-folk tunes.

The Eastern (NZ) are a string band that roars like a punk band, swings like a gospel band, drinks like a country band, works like a bar band, hopes like folk singers, & wants to slow dance & stand on tables all at the same time!

The East Pointers (Canada) Ontario guitarist Jake Charron & seventh generation PEI musicians Tim (fiddle) & Koady Chaisson (banjo) make traditional music seem ridiculously hip. An adrenalised, roof-rattling, performance monster, the trio's excellent new release *Secret Victory*, penned mostly in Australia in early 2015, features beautiful songs & a series of free-wheeling, feisty instrumental jigs, stomps & reels.

Fat Yahooozah What's a Fat Yahooozah? Mash together a bunch of music genres everywhere from afro beat to balkan, to mariachi and klezmer. Throw in some boogaloo & ska, fun & slightly off-kilter vocals plus epic improvised solos, & hey presto!

Frank Yamma

Having toured across North America, Europe & UK in 2015, indigenous soulster Frank Yamma is the man everybody's talking about on the World Music scene & has become one of Australia's most significant indigenous songwriters. With an ability to cross cultural & musical boundaries, when he sings, you listen & travel with him – a love song sung in Pitjantjatjara will make your heart sing in whatever language you speak.

Fred Smith &

Liz Frencham Smith's remarkable career as songwriter & war zone diplomat was the subject of a recent Australian Story documentary. He returns with Liz Frencham to play songs from their back catalogue & his new album *Home*, the follow up to his acclaimed 2011 release.

Gorani meaning "Mountain Men", an 11-voice male vocal group, has been meeting every Tue night since 1992, specialising in Bulgarian songs initially, but mainly singing Georgian songs in recent years.

Travelling to Georgia as a group six times, they have appeared on national TV & radio in Georgia, Bulgaria & Australia.

Gordie Tentrees (Canada)

Yukon based, Ontario raised farm boy, golden glove boxer, school teacher, & youth counsellor turned folk artist, Tentrees has released six records, toured extensively in North America, UK, Australia & Europe, & has been nominated for a slew of awards. Deeply personal & moving, melodic & uplifting, & lyrically rich – master storyteller & multi-instrumental performer delivers songs that will tear your heart out, one note at a time.

The Hannafords have a unique & distinctive flavour to their well-crafted original songs. Little bit Celtic, little bit bluegrass, with a strong folk edge. Sometimes funny, sometimes serious, always enjoyable - their stories are delivered with honesty & skill.

Jali Buba Kuyateh Born in Senegal, & now living in VIC, Jali Buba is a master of traditional kora tunes, & has applied his kora to the Afro Manding styles, soukous of Mali & Guinee Conakry, the mbalakh, reggae, salsa, jazz & blues. Jali has appeared at festivals around Australia including WOMADelaide & The Melbourne International Festival.

Jarryn Phegan a winner from our Yackoustica competition in 2015, & is back with his own place in the program this year. Check out this emerging talent & see the future of Australian music in action.

Jaxon Haldane (Canada) is a songwriter, singer, multi-instrumentalist & record producer. As a member of The D.Rangers, he travelled the country carving out his place in the Canadian folk music scene. Haldane has demonstrated, through his own original recordings, a deft touch for songwriting, combining elements of blues, country, folk & jazz blended into an eclectic mix of proto-rock & roll.

The Jessica Stuart Few

(Canada) this folk-jazz power-trio has one of the freshest sounds on the international indie music scene. Innovative songwriting, stunning three-part harmonies & a unique take on the Japanese koto (13-stringed harp) aside, the trio have a charismatic onstage presence, propelling audiences out of their seats & onto their feet at festivals worldwide.

Joel Havea (Germany) is a Tongan born, Melbourne-raised songwriter, who has spent the past 6 years living in Hamburg, Germany. In between constant touring around Europe & Australia, he has independently released an album & EP and is currently working on his next album in a trio formation with drums & bass.

Joel Sulman Bred in Byron Bay, with a musical upbringing, Sulman learnt about Blues & Roots before dropping the training wheels off his pushbike! His lyrics come from experiences, his music from the heart; bringing northern culture south with his smoky blues voice, eclectic guitar work & cheeky percussion with much success.

Julz Evans brings us music that is honest, earthy & thoughtfully composed. With a full band, featuring cellist Laura Weedy, her music is truly brought to life. The release of her 14-track album *Until It Hurts And Then Some* will be supported with a national tour this November.

Kirsty Bromley (UK) is a young contemporary folk singer based in Sheffield who draws upon a wide range of traditional music. She has a most disarmingly transparent voice, but also the uncanny & beautiful knack of drawing attention to the song rather than the messenger. Her debut album, *Time Ashore*, features original songs & carefully curated folk gems.

The Kissin Cousins hail from NE Victoria & add a fresh, youthful Australian sound to traditional bluegrass & old time music. The Cousins move between frantic Scruggs-style banjo & volcanic mandolin to sweet, melodic ballads. Live & stomping, a show like no other!

Lulu & the Paige-Turners invigorate with a theatrical performance inspired by those of bands such as gypsy-cabaret group Rapsallion & punk-cabaret duo The Dresden Dolls. Lulu & the Paige-Turners blend contemporary folk sounds, sweet pop melodies & cabaret-esque rhythm. Their arresting live performances have mesmerised audiences.

Lucy Wise & Stephen Taberner Lucy's best known as the dream-voiced ukulele song maker in a family band from Margaret River WA; & Stephen, as double bass playing crooner & creator of the Spooky Men's Chorale. Together, they explore a whole bunch of highly necessary conversations between: the bass & the uke, the resonance & the groove, verbal nuance & sweet cadence, grand stupidity & grace.

Marisa Quigley's strong grounding in the power & passion of the blues, shines through in her rich voice & compelling lyrics. Ever the storyteller, the blues/country/folk singer-songwriter strives to engage & entertain her audience with her sometimes haunting, sometimes hilarious stories & songs.

Michaela Alexander is a self taught singer/songwriter/guitarist from NE Victoria, who has been performing & writing for twenty years. After winning the 2015 Yack Folk Festival busking comp she returns for 2016, bringing her distinctively powerful chops & homemade tunes.

Mick Thomas has been a staple of Melbourne's music scene for well over 25 years. Raconteur, troubadour, balladeer & poet, Thomas is best known as the song master of pub-rock icons, Weddings Parties Anything. His band The Roving Commission features Squeezebox Wally on Piano Accordion & a rotating schedule of talented performers to keep the party alive.

Pete Denahy released a comedy album in 2014 which featured songs about overuse of mobile phones, selfies, food & flatulence. The songs have delighted & disgusted a wide range of people, which seems to suit Denahy. Denahy is a five-times Golden Guitar winner at Tamworth Country Music Festival, including another two in 2016.

Phil Rourke & Mitch Huon Beechworth & Yack locals Rourke (vocals, guitar, banjo, mandolin & stomp box) & Huon (harmonica, guitar & vocals) play a variety of blues, folk, Australiana & Americana influenced songs. Rourke's catalogue contains humorous songs about his life as a shearer & a few good old fashioned songs dedicated to a man's best friends....beer & whiskey!

The Northern Folk are a 9-piece alternative ensemble from Albury, with a merging of folk/blues/funk/rock. Focusing on original songs with group vocal sections, murky bass lines, & big catchy horn hooks, The Northern Folk mix high-energy moments with stripped back acoustic sound, targeted at all demographics & groovers.

Richard Perso

Yackandandah's Richard Perso has come a long way since winning the busking comp back in 2007. Soon after, he burst onto the Australian & later the world stage, combining Australia's tradition didgeridoo with a unique blend of folky rocking blues. The Perso dynamo is excited to be back for 2016.

Scott Cook (Canada) A roots balladeer with a rare personal warmth, Cook has managed to distil the stories collected over years of near-incessant touring across Canada, the USA, Europe, Asia, & Australia, into straight-talking, keenly observant verse. All the hard miles notwithstanding, he still believes that songs can change your life, & your life can change the world.

Sheehan Smith & Sheehan

Marni, Mark & Dave play traditional songs in a blues or country style, some dating back to the 1800s, or classics penned by Robert Johnson & Woody Guthrie. Originals are stylistically in keeping & are co-written/arranged by all members. Audiences love the sparkle, variety

& humour of this act, whose songs deal with fundamental human concerns – love, hate, sex, death, injustice, & survival.

Sheila Kay Adams

(USA) is a ballad singer, banjo player, writer & story teller from North Carolina. For seven generations, her family has maintained the tradition of passing down the English, Scottish, & Irish ballads. Adams was awarded a National Heritage Fellowship in 2013, & received the North Carolina Heritage Award 2015. Her innovating tunes, with her signature drop-thumb style banjo skills, have won her numerous awards.

Steve Tyson *Green Side Up*, an album of war, love, murder & humour, is the second album of eclectic folk songs from Byron Bay based singer-songwriter Steve Tyson, resonating strongly with critics who honoured it with 4 star reviews in the national music press.

Tom Richardson After living & touring throughout Canada, Europe & Indonesia, Richardson

returns home to Australia with a brand new CD, inspiring one-man live show & infectious demeanour. An adventurous yet humble artist who appreciates the freedom of travel, exploration, & the privilege of forging relationships with listeners & cultures around the world.

Tooze & Bruce are Melbourne folk pop duo, singer songwriters Luke Tooze & Simon Bruce who have been hanging out nonstop for the past year. Their lyrics jump around from straight up pop songs to philosophical voyages. But above all, their harmonies are making people's ears prick up all over town.

Whiteline For almost two decades, this trio has blended its

individual musical influences into a unique Australian Folk Rock style, creating intimate ballads about rural Australia. Take a journey with them through past & present, & be left with a warm feeling of strength, resilience & contentment that is truly Australian.

True Spirit Revival-

Yoga with live Music is an exciting workshop collaboration between Canadian-born yoga instructor, Kimberly Erin, & internationally renowned Australian singer-songwriter, Tom Richardson.
